

COMMANDER'S COMMENTS

I am writing these words on the saddest evening that I can ever recall – Tuesday, September 11th, 2001. This morning, whether Americans knew it or not, we went to war.

You will have the benefit of three weeks of history to see what this war brought to our enemy, our allies, and ourselves; but make no mistake- this is a war. Those who would describe today's attacks as the work of "terrorists" trivialize both the attack and the response. The objectives, goals and means employed by our enemies are not designed to persuade, but to destroy; not to influence, but annihilate. These are the hallmarks of war, not a terrorist campaign. I hope and pray that America's response was swift, just and thorough. I also hope and pray that the best of Americans will surface; that justice once dealt out will satisfy the lust of revenge, that we don't measure that justice by comparing body counts, and that we don't lose the essence of this country in a search for freedom from fear. I hope and pray that no one reading these words lost a loved one in the opening battle of this war. And above all, I hope and pray that the world reacts to this attack with the horror and revulsion that it deserves.

I have no way of knowing at this time what the 174th's role will be in the response – whether it will range from moral support for those providing homeland defense, active participation in the recovery and rescue efforts in New York City, or mobilization and deployment in support of military operations overseas; but whatever the tasking, I am certain that we will execute the mission in a way that will reflect the character of the finest group of men and women that it has been my privilege to

serve with. Our families, our community, our state, and our nation count on us to be there when needed, to serve with distinction and honor in whatever capacity we are needed. THRIFT SAVINGS PLAN PROGRAM

Beginning 9 Oct 01, members of the uniformed services will be able to enroll in the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) during a special 60-day enrollment period. Below is some important information you need to know about this great new benefit available to you.

What is the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP)?

The TSP is a retirement saving and investment plan that has been available to civilian employees of the Federal Government since 1987. Its purpose is to provide retirement income and offers participants the same type of savings and tax benefits that many private corporations offer their employees under "401 (k) plans". The money that participants invest in the TSP comes from pre-tax dollars and reduces your current taxable income; and investments and earnings are not taxed until they are withdrawn.

How does TSP differ from the Military Retirement System?

Participation in the TSP is optional and not automatic. You must sign up with your respective service to participate. You contribute to the TSP from your own pay on a pre-tax basis, and the amount you contribute and the earnings form the investment belong to you. They are yours to keep even if you do not serve the 20 years ordinarily necessary to receive military retired pay.

Who can contribute to the TSP as members of the uniformed services?

All uniformed members of the armed ser-

vices and members of the Ready Reserve and National Guard can contribute.

When will I be able to join TSP?

You will be able to enroll in TSP from 9 Oct 01 to 31 Jan 02 in a "special open season". Contributions to the TSP, based upon sign-up, will begin to be deducted from your basic pay in Jan 02. Members who do not enroll during the "special open season" will have two "open seasons" per year (currently scheduled for 15 May – 31 Jul and 15 Nov – 31 Jan) to enroll thereafter.

How much can I contribute?

In 2002, you can contribute up to 7% of your basic pay each month through automatic deduction. You may also be able to contribute all or a percentage of any special or incentive pay, including reenlistment or other bonuses but to do so you must already be contributing to the TSP from your basic pay. However, the total amount you contribute each year can not exceed the IRS's limit for that year (for 2001, the limit is \$10,500; the limit is recalculated each year and may be higher in 2002).

Can I contribute to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) and the TSP in the same year?

Yes. Participation in the TSP does not affect your ability to contribute to an IRA.

How are my contributions invested?

You have five investment funds to choose

from that cover the market spectrum.

Can I make withdrawals or take a loan from my account?

TSP is a long-term retirement savings plan with special tax advantages so withdrawals are permitted in only two cases: 1) age-based in-service withdrawals for participants who are 59 1/2 or older and 2) financial hardship in-service withdrawals for participants who can document the hardship. Withdrawals can not be paid back so they will permanently deplete your retirement savings. The TSP Loan Program allows you to borrow your own contributions and earnings. The minimum and maximum loan amount is \$1,000 and \$50,000 respectively and is paid back with interest.

What are my withdrawal options once I separate from the uniformed services?

You have several: 1) receive a single payment, 2) receive a series of monthly payments, 3) request a TSP annuity, or 4) leave your money in the TSP.

It's Important! The Government Travel Card

You are probably getting tired of reading about Government Travel Card issues, but the very fact that the subject keeps showing up in the EnGarde month after month should tell you the importance

of our being in full compliance with this program. The program works when everyone is working with it. Please contact our office if you have any questions or concerns. So, here's the latest!

Pay Offset to the Government Travel-card Program

All Government Travel Card (GTC) cardholders over 90 days delinquent will be subject to pay offset as of 3 September 2001. Both Bank of America (BOA) and Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) will send letters to the member prior to pay offset. Pay offset will likely begin in the month of October for both military

and civilian employees. Administrative processing fees of \$157 will be assessed against members subject to pay offset. A maximum of 15% of a member's disposable pay may be offset each pay period. Pay offset may be avoided by enrolling in the Fixed Payment Plan with BOA. To enroll, contact BOA as soon as possible at 1-800-472-1424. Please recognize that pay offset is an issue between BOA, DFAS, and the cardholder. While the Wing Financial Management Office can provide advice to members, we cannot stop, start, or influence the GTC debt collection process.

Infrequent Travelers Need to Verify Account Status Prior to TDY

BOA has deactivated the accounts of infrequent card-users. An infrequent card-user is one that has not used the GTC in the past 12 months. As such, we advise infrequent card-users to check their account activation status prior to beginning travel. **Please contact the base Agency Program Coordinator, Senior Master Sgt. Judy VanWie, at 454-6484.**

Other Reminders

\$10 Administrative Fee: If you opt to have money transferred from your personal bank account to Bank of America, a \$10 administrative fee will be assessed to your account.

FedEx Charge: If you have a travel-card FedEx'd on your behalf, you will be assessed a \$20 delivery charge. (This charge may be reimbursable under certain conditions.)

Card Receipt Verification: You must verify card receipt by calling the bank upon receiving a card via mail. Otherwise BOA will cancel your account for security purposes.

When to Use the Card: A good rule of thumb is "members are authorized to use the card if they will be filing a DD1351-2 Travel Voucher".

Split Disbursement: The best way to pay your GTC bill is by indicating Split Disbursement on your travel voucher AND writing in the dollar amount that you desire to be applied to your GTC account.

Servicemember's Group Life Insurance (SGLI) Available to Family members

The Veterans' Opportunities Act of 2001 for the first time extends life insurance coverage to spouses and children of Guardsmen insured under the Servicemembers Group Life Insurance (SGLI) program, effective 1 Nov 2001.

All married members of the Guard who have SGLI coverage in effect on November 1, 2001 will automatically obtain SGLI coverage for their spouse, unless they fill out a new SGLV 8286A form prior to November 1, 2001 to disenroll or reduce coverage for their spouse. The premium amount varies based on the age of the spouse.

Family coverage will be available only for member's insured under the SGLI program. You will be able to purchase up to \$100,000 of SGLI coverage

for your spouse, in increments of \$10,000. However, you will not be able to purchase more SGLI coverage for your spouse than you have on yourself. For example, if you have \$50,000 of SGLI coverage you may only purchase \$50,000 of SGLI coverage for your spouse.

Each dependent child of every servicemember, who has SGLI coverage, will automatically be insured for \$10,000. Coverage on your children is free to you and will not exceed \$10,000 for any reason.

The spouse coverage can be converted to a commercial policy with a participating company upon restrictions as mandated by the office of SGLI.

In summary, to prevent money from

being taken from your check, you must decline or reduce coverage for your spouse before the November 1, 2001 deadline. You may make changes after that date, but will receive no refund for the previous months deductions.

Remember these changes will only affect married members that already have some sort of SGLI coverage.

- You **must** fill out an application each semester
- You **must** be accepted or currently enrolled in a participating school
- You **must** be in "good standing" in the NYANG
- You **must** be a legal resident of New York State (180 days)
- You **must** carry a minimum of six (6) semester hours
- You **must** be matriculated in a degree-producing program
- You **must** apply for all available non-debt producing financial aid (TAP/PELL)

BOSS LIFT

Over 40 local employers and media representatives recently participated in a luncheon, Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) briefing and "Boss Lift" at the 174th Fighter Wing. The luncheon at the 174th FW's Dining Hall included comments by the Wing Commanders of the 174th FW and 152nd AOG on the importance of employer support of the Guard.

Immediately following the luncheon, the group boarded a KC-135 tanker from the 107th Airlift Refueling Wing to witness firsthand F-16s from the 174th FW being refueled.
